- Need to have at least the product name, manufacturer name, and the product number or UPC code if possible.
- ALL shifts must have access to the fax machine.
- Labels on bulk containers, do they match its contents?
- Labeling differences between permanent & temporary containers.

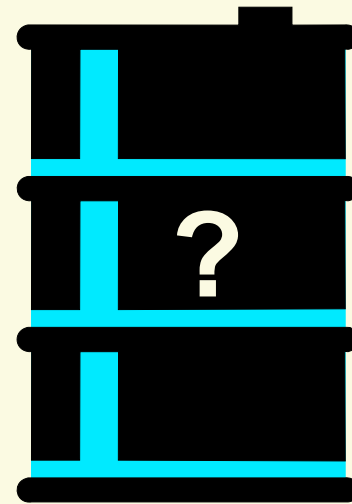


## Chemicals entering the Workplace

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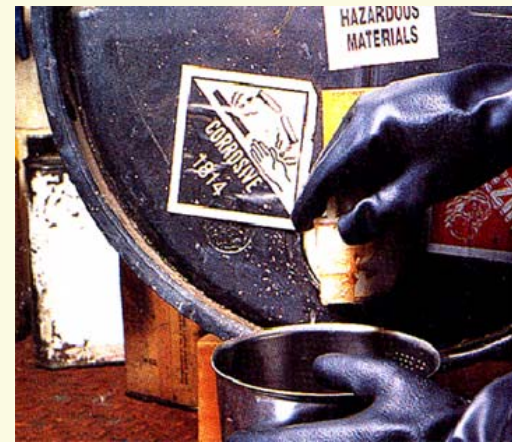
Each container of hazardous chemicals entering the workplace must be labeled or marked with:

- Identity of the chemical
- Appropriate hazard warnings
- Name and address of the responsible party



## Container Labeling in the Workplace

- ❑ The hazard warning can be any type of message, picture, or symbol that provides information on the hazards of the chemical(s) and the targeted organs affected, if applicable
- ❑ Labels must be legible, in English (plus other languages, if desired), and prominently displayed



## Labeling Requirements

- In-plant containers of hazardous materials must be labeled, tagged, or marked with material identity (COMMON NAME) and appropriate warning(s).
- Secondary containers, such as in-process or temporary portable containers, must be labeled with at least the common name of the chemical.

30 CFR 47.44b

Operator must mark the temporary container with at least the common name of its contents.

- Never remove labels





## Labeling Jugs

- Etch oil name & grade to match color scheme
- Use permanent or paint marker to trace in etch
