


SUSTAINABLE EDUCATION



Vulcan is proud to partner with local schools in our quarry communities and use our people and operations to enhance student learning. Our Adopt-a-School program includes partnerships with elementary schools and even entire school districts.

We think of our personnel as instructors and our quarries as outdoor classrooms that augment the local classroom experience. We also underwrite local educational programs and work with all levels of local school administration. For instance, during Earth Science Day each year at McCook Quarry, the entire sixth grade of the school district comes and learns about geology. The highly anticipated day of learning is an effort by our Adopt-a-School partner, LaGrange School District 105, to allow students to learn firsthand how science, technology, engineering and math are used every day to better the world.

Vulcan also supports a local high school robotics group and hosts quarry tours at several of its locations for elementary schools. Bolingbrook Quarry has an annual "Cub Scouts Day" where local Cub Scouts troops tour the facility and get classroom and hands-on experiences during the day. In addition, Vulcan provides product donations to local Eagle Scouts who are learning responsibility and community service while beautifying the community. METROPOLITAN WATER RECLAMATION DISTRICT

Vulcan Materials Company Midwest Division has a pivotal role in the development of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) of Greater Chicago Tunnel and Reservoir Plan (TARP) McCook Reservoir, which will be the largest of three reservoirs in the TARP system. The McCook Reservoir is designed to capture rain event overflow caused by combined sewer capacity constraints. Vulcan is mining MWRD property in order to create space in which MWRD can operate the reservoir. The mining is underway in two stages: the first stage will result in 3.5 billion gallons of storage (to be completed in 2017) and the second stage will result in 6.5 billion gallons of storage (to be completed in 2023). MWRD estimates the reservoir to provide more than \$114 million per year in flood damage reduction benefits to 3,100,000 people in 37 communities.

ILLINOIS STATE TOLL HIGHWAY AUTHORITY

In an effort to promote sustainability and generate a "win-win" opportunity, Vulcan approached the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority while partnering with various ready mix concrete producers to use waste carbonate fines, from mining operations, as all or part of the fine aggregate fraction in Portland cement concrete mixtures.
